



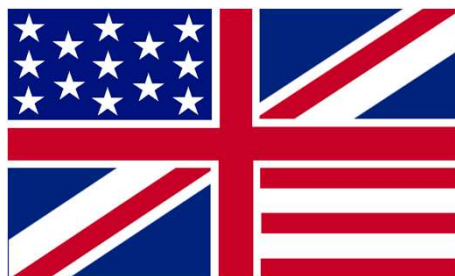

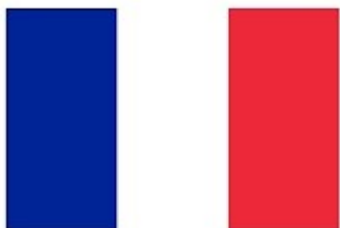

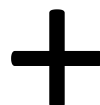

What does a *Language and Culture* course consist of?

54 hours on Specialized

**LANGUAGE COURSES HAVE A LARGER NUMBER OF HOURS COMPARED TO THE
OTHER COURSES**

The second foreign language courses are **advanced courses**:



Absolute beginners have to attend a **preparatory course**
during the first semester.

At the beginning of the course, the Native Speaker Assistant will take care of international students by dedicating a few hours of practice just for them.

If you're an international student, it's crucial to have a B2 level (or higher) of Italian language proficiency. If you don't, don't worry!



As part of the study plan of the MA in International Tourism and Destination Management, there's a lab on [Italian Language and Culture for Tourism](#) reserved for international students. For the lab, a minimum of 70% attendance is required. All classes of the lab are taught in Italian (with English used only when needed); so it is recommended that students already have an A2/B1 language level.



CLA – University Language Centre



The **University Language Centre (CLA)** can help you if you feel like your level of linguistic competence in Italian is too low!

The CLA organizes **Italian language courses** certifying language knowledge and skills graded according to six levels, from A2 to C2.
